

With a heavy heart we inform that this past January Nitya Seva USA lost two of its avid and longtime supporters.

Raj (Avdhesh Kumar) Nigam had been an ardent supporter since the inception of Nitya Seva USA in 2010. Raj personified all that makes a human being great. He had unsurpassed empathy and compassion which extended to the Nitya Seva Children. His generosity went beyond donations to active participation. During the covid pandemic, he provided one-to-one instructions to three Nitya Seva children by zoom for nearly two years. These children, a twelfth grader and two eleventh graders had unique needs requiring different skills in instruction. All three began to love and admire Raj for his pedagogical skills and caring, and the life lessons and values he instilled in them.

Dr. Ram Prasad Srivastav was associated with Nitya Seva USA since its very inception. A teacher par excellence, he saw many generations of students cross the threshold of SUNY at Stony Brook in Long Island where he was a professor. Before coming to USA, he taught Mathematics at Indian Institute of technology (IIT) Kanpur in India. Three of our board members were amongst his students, the relationships that turned into deep friendships over time. His checks arrived regularly, without fail during our winter fund drive and in between as well. "Just a little extra for the children" he would say.

Nitya Seva participating in Private Sponsorship Program of the Government of Madhya Pradesh

This recently launched MP government program seeks partnership from private parties (individuals, organizations, industries, and corporations) to provide financial aid to children from economically distressed families, typically families who have lost the earning parent to covid. With this novel approach, the program addresses the gap left by earlier government schemes aiding children orphaned by covid. Under the Private Sponsorship Program, private parties who agree to participate deposit two thousand rupees per month in the child's bank account for at least one year.

Nitya Seva has joined the program and will help twenty such children in Bhopal. Thirteen of these children have been identified and aid has already commenced while the process for seven more is under way. Nitya seva will not be limiting the aid to the one-year period, it will continue till the child turns eighteen. In fact, Nitya Seva has already gone beyond the requirements of the program. We have done our own Needs Assessment for every child. Based on this assessment, we are providing more help in cash and kind for those children/families where the two thousand rupees per month is found to be insufficient to meet their needs. Nitya seva will also maintain contact and continuity with the children's families to provide the much-needed family support and love to ensure program's success.
